



Balshaws' gallant schools' seven-aside final bid

COWLEY Grammar School, St. Helens, won the Parkes trophy in the schools seven-a-side Rugby competition at Ansdell yesterday. But the glory went to defeated finalists Balshaw's Grammar School.

Balshaws lost their captain, Kenneth Mather, with a broken ankle, when they were five points behind in the final. With six men they snatched a 6-5 lead through same brilliant Rugby by Smith, held the lead until A. Hall had to leave with a badly cut eye and then with five men they ended the game losers by 13-6

Cowley last won the competition, which is organised annually by the Fylde club, in 1949. To reach the final this year they beat St. Joseph's. Blackpool Wallasey Grammar School. Audenshaw (Manchester) and the holders Barrow Grammar School.

29 ENTRIES

Twenty-nine teams entered representing 18 schools from all over Lancashire. Some entered a first and second team. King George V School, South-

port entered two teams. The first team lost in the first round and the second team reached the semi-final, to be defeated by Balshaws 11-8 after extra time.

Preston Grammar School, who received a first round Lye. lost the second round game against Audenshaw 5-0.
